The museum building was built in 1894 as the Municipality building. Visited by the Great Leader Atatürk on December 20, 1930, the building has been serving as the Directorate of Kırklareli Museum since 1994.

The Museum consists of three sections. Embalmed animals representing the species that are currently living and has lived in our region are exhibited in the Nature Hall on the ground floor. On the upper floor, the artifacts uncovered during the excavations in Babaeski Düğüncülü, Vize Çakıllı, and Yündolan Tumulus as well as Vize Ancient Theatre and Demirköy Iron Foundry are exhibited. Artifacts belonging to Neolithic and Chalcolithic periods unearthed in Aşağıpınar and Kanlıgeçit excavations are exhibited in separate sections.

In the section reserved for ethnographic objects, some depictions of village life in the Kırklareli region, local outfits, and handmade items as well as jewelry, weapons and other ethnographic objects are exhibited. Some of the Hellenistic, Roman, Byzantine and Ottoman coins belonging to the coin collection of the Kırklareli Museum are exhibited on the second floor.

This is the most detailed "Cavalry" scene secured in Thrace. A Thracian Cavalry, probably returned from or about to go to an expedition, making a wish at the altar under a sacred tree or making a visit of gratitude is depicted.
