HUNGARIAN LAJOS KOSSUTH IN KÜTAHYA



In the first half of the 19th century, establishing an independent national bourgeois state in Hungary was planned under the leadership of Lajos Kossuth. On March 15, 1848, the revolution broke out in Pest, but Austria signed a military alliance with the Russian Czar and defeated the Hungarian liberation war. As a result, Lajos Kossuth left the country on August 17, 1849 and settled in Vidin with the refugees. Although Austria and Russia wanted the refugees to be delivered, the refugees were not delivered due to the diplomatic stance of the Ottoman Empire. Refugees who came from Vidin to Shumen and from there to Kütahya via Bursa in 1850 were settled in Barracks in Kütahya. Lajos Kossuth was later placed in this 18th-century house, where he continued his work and drafted the Hungarian constitution. Kossuth left the Ottoman Empire on 22 August 1851 and went to England first and then to America. He later moved to Italy and settled in Turin. He continued the war he fought for the independence of Hungary until he died on March 20, 1894.



Lajos Kossuth (1802-1894), one of the leaders of the Hungarian freedom war, was hosted in this house with his family between 1850-1851 and prepared the Hungarian constitution draft in this house.
