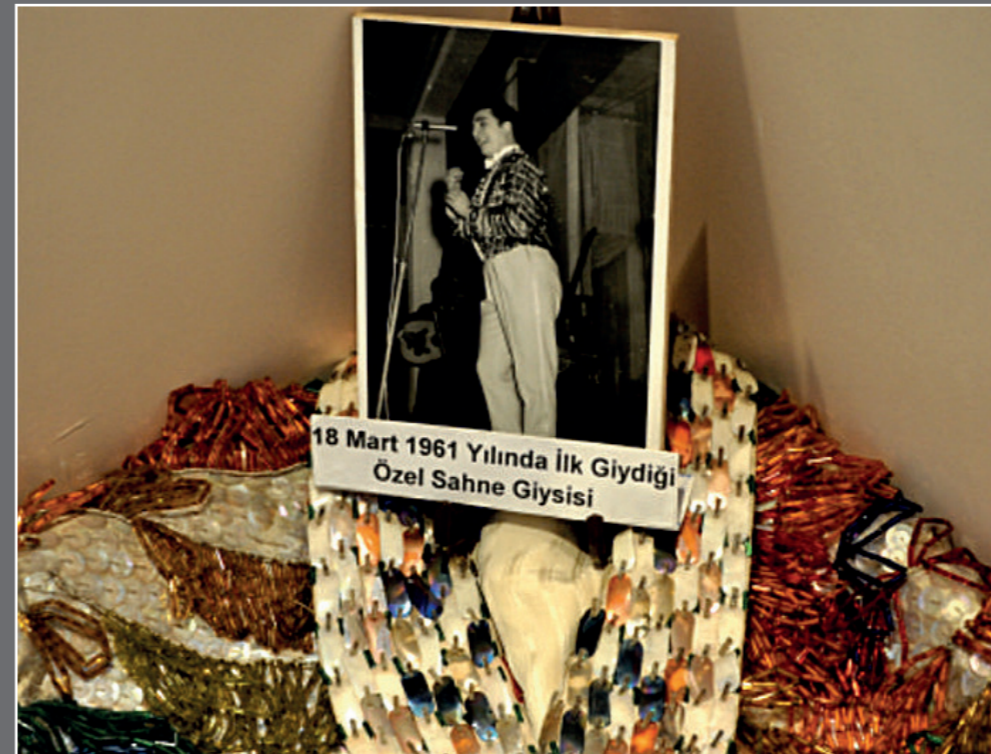

BODRUM ZEKİ MÜREN ART MUSEUM



The two-story house in Bodrum, where Zeki Müren, one of Turkey's most important artists, lived from 1980 until his death in 1996, was restored by the Ministry of Culture on 08 June 2000, turned into a museum and opened to visitors. The ground floor of Zeki Müren's house was decorated in accordance with the original style as the artist lived; the upper floor is arranged as a museum.

In the museum, information and documents related to the artist's life and works, photographs as well as stage clothes and personal belongings are exhibited.

Zeki Müren, who was born in Bursa on December 6, 1931, is considered one of the greatest names of Classical Turkish Music. Known as "The Sun of Art", Zeki Müren was awarded the title of State Artist in 1991. He was also given the first Gold Plaque Award in Turkey. He composed more than three hundred songs during his musical life.

Zeki Müren, who graduated from the Professional Decoration Department at the Istanbul State Academy of Fine Arts (now Mimar Sinan University), continued her education in pattern design as well as his music career. He designed most of the stage outfits himself. Also engaged in painting, he has exhibited both his paintings and designs in many cities.

He died in 1996 as a result of a heart attack during the ceremony held for him.
