
























The artefacts collected from Söğüt, Bilecik and their villages and Eskisehir Yörük village by the Board established in 1973 are the core of the Söğüt Ertuğrul Gazi Museum. These artefacts were initially stored in the Eskişehir Archaeological Museum warehouse and were brought to Söğüt and placed in the display cases after the museum building was completed.



Söğüt Ertuğrul Gazi Museum first opened on September 12, 1981, across the street from Ertuğrul Gazi Tomb in the building currently used as Halime Hatun Mosque. The building, which has been used as a museum since September 8, 2001, is a historical building built in the early 20th century by the mayor of Memiş Ağa as "Winding House". It was built at the beginning of the 20th century. This three-story building, which is believed to have once served as a dispensary, or health center in the modern sense, stands out for its woodwork.



The exhibition hall on the top floor of the museum mainly displays clothes reflecting the culture of the Söğüt and Bilecik area, hand-knotted carpets rugs and saddlebags, weapons, weighing instruments and various items used in daily life. The museum, which sheds light on the history of the region with the products reflecting the folk culture of Söğüt, the founding place of Ottoman Empire, is open to anyone who wants to explore the traces of a universal empire that extended to three continents.
